Another busy and exciting week at Karuah Public School, with many wonderful examples of our students demonstrating the values we focus on every day.

As a **Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)** school, we operate on a fortnightly focus linked to one of our core values — **Respect, Responsibility and Pride**. PBL allows us to explicitly teach the behaviours and expectations we want students to demonstrate across all areas of school life.

Over the coming fortnight, our focus is **Responsibility – being in the right place at the right time**. This includes arriving at school on time, moving promptly between learning areas, being organised for lessons and ensuring students are where they are expected to be throughout the day. While this may sound simple, these routines build strong habits that support learning, independence and positive participation in school life.

Encouragingly, we continue to see many students demonstrating these values not only in the classroom but also through the way they represent our school in the wider community.

*Last weekend, **Lily and Max** proudly represented the region at the **NSW State Cup Oztag Championships in Coffs Harbour**. What a fantastic achievement and we are incredibly proud of the way they represented both our school and community.*

*Earlier this week, two of our school soccer teams represented Karuah Public School at the **NSW Football Gala Day**. It was wonderful to see students participating enthusiastically, demonstrating teamwork, resilience and great sportsmanship throughout the day.*

*We also congratulate **Harrison, Lily and Florence**, who represented our school at the **PSSA Zone Swimming Carnival**. It is always exciting to see our students stepping up to represent Karuah Public School at these events and we are very proud of their efforts.*

Responsibility and pride in our community were also on display this week as students enthusiastically participated in cleaning up our school grounds and surrounding community areas in preparation for **Clean Up Australia Day** this Sunday. It was wonderful to see students taking ownership of their environment and contributing positively to the place we all share.



*Another important aspect of responsibility at school is **regular attendance**. Congratulations to all students who enjoyed our **attendance reward day** this week.*

*It is important for families to remember that the focus on attendance is not unique to Karuah Public School; it is a **NSW Department of Education priority**, supported by extensive research highlighting the strong links between attendance, academic progress, student wellbeing and child protection.*

At times, the focus on attendance can feel personal, and we understand that conversations sometimes occur at home around the expectations, scrutiny or reward systems. However, this initiative sits within a broader state-wide framework designed to support student learning and wellbeing.

*Holidays during school time or simply “staying home” can have a significant impact not only on missed learning progressions but also on teacher planning, intervention programs and sometimes staffing arrangements. Students with genuine short-term illness are **not negatively impacted** within the rewards program, and those experiencing longer-term illness generally only experience an impact within one cycle. This approach ensures the process remains fair and equitable while supporting improved attendance across NSW public schools.*

*Families are welcome to explore further information about attendance expectations through the **NSW Department of Education website**.*

*Strong partnerships between schools and families are essential in supporting student success. For this reason, I would also like to remind families of the **NSW Department of Education School Community Charter**, which outlines the shared expectations for respectful and productive relationships between schools, families and the wider community.*

The charter is built around three key principles — **Collaborative, Respectful Communication** — and recognises that the best outcomes for students occur when schools and families work together in partnership.

Parents and carers can expect to be welcomed into schools, receive timely and professional communication from staff and be treated fairly with honesty, transparency and mutual respect.

In return, all members of the school community share a responsibility to communicate respectfully with staff and support positive relationships within the school environment. The charter makes it clear that aggressive, intimidating or offensive behaviour — including threatening language, abusive communication or derogatory comments — is not acceptable within NSW public school communities.

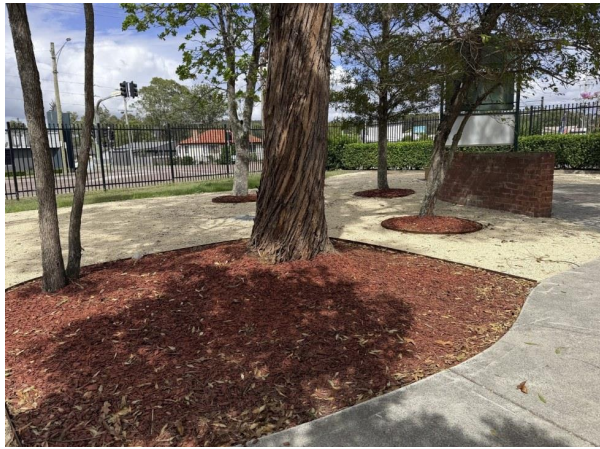
Where behaviour does not meet these expectations, schools may take steps to address the situation. This may include managing how communication occurs with the school, restricting contact with staff or the school site, or in more serious cases referring matters to appropriate authorities.

At Karuah Public School we are fortunate to have a supportive and respectful community, and we thank our families for continuing to work with us in partnership to create a positive environment for all students.

*Many families may have noticed the **significant groundwork that took place late last year outside the Year 6 classroom**. This project forms part of our **School Excellence Plan**, which focuses on ensuring our school environment continues to support our growing community despite limited space. The drainage and ground compaction work completed is in preparation for a future **outdoor learning space**.*

*The next stages include planning a small amphitheatre-style learning area, sandstone block seating zones and consultation with local Elders regarding cultural signage and naming for the space. **As part of this work, our historical Bicentennial pavers — purchased by families many years ago — have been carefully relocated to border the new garden areas. This ensures these special pavers continue to be honoured as part of our school's history and remain a visible reminder of the families who have contributed to Karuah Public School over generations.***

We are very excited to see this project develop into another beautiful and purposeful learning space for our students.



Finally, some lovely news to share — congratulations to our wonderful **Miss Hicks**, who recently shared with families that she is expecting her **first child**. We are absolutely thrilled for her.

Miss Hicks is expected to commence maternity leave around **mid Term 2**, at which time **Mr Gilshenan** will move from **Stage 2 Wambuyn** to take over **Stage 3 Waakan** for the remainder of the year.

It seems there might be something in the water at Karuah Public School!

As always, I am incredibly proud of our students, staff and families. The pride our students show in representing their school, caring for their community and supporting one another continues to make Karuah Public School a wonderful place to learn and grow.

- Professional relationships with school staff are based on transparency, honesty and mutual respect.
- To be treated fairly. Tolerance and understanding are promoted as we respect diversity.

Communicating with our schools

Respectful communication is a right

In all workplaces people have the right to feel respected. Unacceptable and offensive behaviour has no place in our school communities.

To ensure the wellbeing of students, staff and the community in our schools, steps will be taken to address unacceptable behaviour. This may include restricting contact with the school community or, in more serious cases, referral to NSW Police.



Unacceptable behaviour may include but is not limited to:

- Aggressive or intimidating actions, such as violence, threatening gestures or physical proximity.
- Aggressive or intimidating language, including the use of obscenities, making sexist, racist or derogatory comments or using a rude tone.
- Treating members of the school community differently due to aspects such as their religion or disability.
- Inappropriate and time wasting communication.

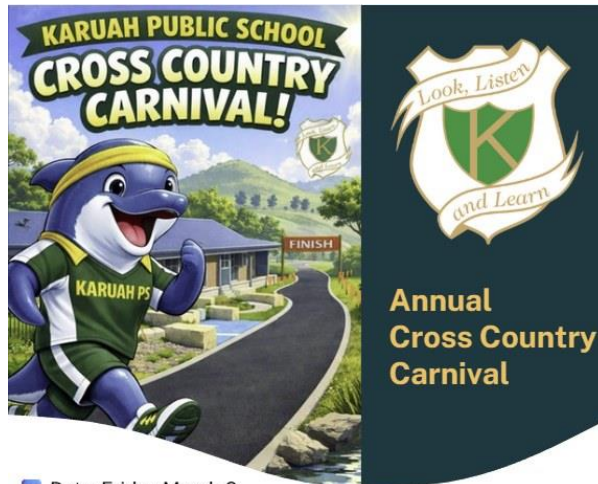


PBL Focus – Cyber Safety

Aboriginal Education

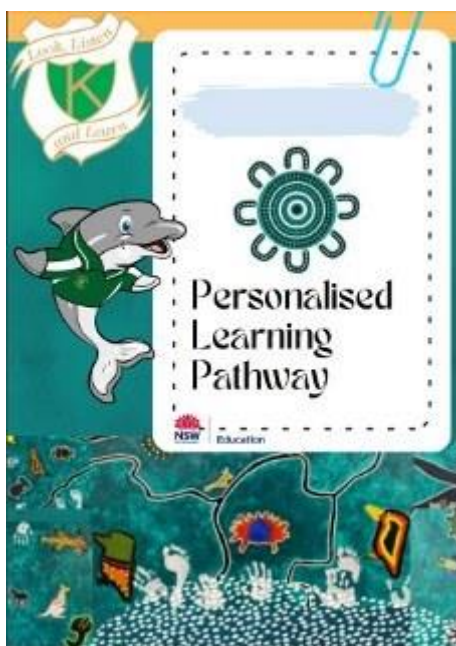


Each year we complete **Personalized Learning Pathways (PLP's)** for all our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. The PLP's are an active process, which are developed in a consultation process between the student, parents/carers, and teachers, to identify, organise and apply personal approaches to learning and engagement. They can have short term or long-term goals. Short term goals can be specific stepping stones to reach long term goals.

It is recommended that all Aboriginal students have a PLP that is tailored to the student and is regularly reviewed and updated. The PLPs will change as the student moves from learning stage to learning stage. It is expected that the PLPs developed in Stage 3 will be used to support student/s transition into Year 7.

Students have been working hard with Aunty Nicki and their teachers to set Learning and Cultural goals for this year. At this stage Years 5 and 6 have completed their Cultural plans, some students have wanted to add new photos to their plans. More information can be added after they meet with their Parents/Carers and Teachers on our PLP afternoon.

The responses from the students looking back over their plans from the last few years have been great especially when they see how far they have come.


